

**2013 Other Elected Officials and Miscellaneous Expenses in Franklin County**

**Other Elected Officials- General Fund**

<b>Auditor's Office</b>	<b>ORC 319</b>	<b>\$3,152,187</b>
<p>The Auditor's Office provides financial services for the general public, political subdivisions and County agencies so they can fulfill their financial obligations. The office is responsible for payments, settlements and distributions of taxes, licenses and inspections of weighing and measuring devices. The county auditor shall also prepare a financial report of the county for the preceding fiscal year in such form as prescribed by the auditor of state.</p>		
<b>Coroner's Office</b>	<b>ORC 313</b>	<b>\$3,311,771</b>
<p>The mission of the Coroner's Office is to serve and protect the interests of the community by maintaining the highest standard of professionalism and integrity in determining the cause and manner of death. There may be established suitable quarters, laboratories, and equipment necessary for the proper performance of the duties of the coroner.</p>		
<b>Data Center</b>	<b>ORC 307.84-307.847</b>	<b>\$7,583,342</b>
<p>The county auditor shall be the chief administrator of the county automatic data processing board and may employ a deputy who shall serve under his direction. The auditor deputy shall supervise the operation of the automatic data processing center. Salaries and expenses of the center shall be paid from funds budgeted and appropriated to the board by the board of county commissioners. The administrator may adopt such rules and regulations as are necessary for the operation of the center.</p>		
<b>Recorder's Office</b>	<b>ORC 317</b>	<b>\$2,916,165</b>
<p>The county recorder shall keep six separate sets of records as follows: deeds, mortgages, a record of powers of attorney, plats, leases, and declarations executed pursuant to section 2133.02 of the Revised Code and durable powers of attorney for health care executed pursuant to section 1337.12 of the Revised Code. The Franklin County Recorder's Office also provides archival document conversion and indexing services to Franklin County agencies, so that they can preserve public records, reducing space requirements for records storage and redacting confidential data from archived documents.</p>		
<b>Treasurer's Office</b>	<b>ORC 321</b>	<b>\$1,904,057</b>
<p>The county treasurer provides billing and collection services to property owners, manufactured home owners, and business owners and their agents so they can meet their tax obligations in a timely manner and cash management and investment strategy services that ensure the safety, liquidity, and yield to Franklin County and its agencies so they can receive a reasonable return on their monies and have their funds available as needed.</p>

<b>Benefits &amp; Risk Management</b>	<b>ORC 305.171</b>	<b>\$235,532</b>
<p>The Department of Benefits &amp; Risk Management provides health and wellness benefits to members of the Franklin County Cooperative Health Benefits Program and mitigates occupational and property risk to Franklin County employees so that they can live healthier, safer lives.</p>		
<b>Board of County Commissioners</b>	<b>ORC 305</b>	<b>\$3,242,746</b>
<p>The mission of the Board of Commissioners' Office is to provide leadership and fiscal stewardship for our community so that Franklin County remains among the best managed counties in the nation. In order to accomplish this, the Board of Commissioners' Office will maintain Franklin County's fiscal security, stability, and sustainability; maintain Franklin County's ability to meet critical needs in difficult economic times; maintain Franklin County's excellent credit ratings; and maintain necessary and essential programs and service delivery capacity.</p>		
<b>Economic Development &amp; Planning</b>	<b>ORC 307.07, 303.02</b>	<b>\$1,865,293</b>
<p>Economic Development and Planning Department mission is to create and retain jobs, to organize growth supporting environmental sustainability, social equity, and economic vitality for all communities in Franklin County.</p>		
<b>General Services Department</b>	<b>n/a</b>	<b>\$5,716,971</b>
<p>The mission of the General Services Department is to position itself as a leader with Franklin County through implementation of cost effective procurement, printing, mail and surplus property services measures, as well as to provide safe vehicles to county employees so that supported county agencies have the goods and services they need to perform their jobs.</p>		
<b>Human Resources</b>	<b>ORC 124.14</b>	<b>\$939,991</b>
<p>The Human Resources Department mission is to provide quality employment services, effective training, technical human resources assistance, innovative group insurance benefits programs, and risk management services for the Franklin County Board of Commissioners' and other designated agencies so they can continue efficient agency operations.</p>		
<b>Reserves and Contingencies</b>	<b>various</b>	<b>\$12,980,199</b>
<p>The purpose of the Reserves Program is to provide economic stabilization services for Franklin County so basic services can be maintained in the event of a financial crisis. Included in this amount are appropriations held in reserve for termination and other payouts not budgeted as well as amounts held in contingency.</p>
